A secondary major concern is that the sea-front seating and public spaces be properly maintained. Both of these objectives would go a long way towards making the town more attractive to visitors. I would favour a Town or Parish Council if it could be empowered to fulfil these two aims. My concern about the proposal is three-fold:- a) that North Tyneside Metropolitan Borough Council will seek to retain its powers over The Links, in which case I see my main reason for supporting a Town or Parish Council falling away b) that the revenue required to achieve such objectives would be too great for the population to raise over and above the existing Council Tax. c) that the Town or Parish Council becomes merely a microcosm of the North Tyneside MBC inasmuch as it becomes dominated by party political animals. However, I confess to much ignorance on the whole subject and am willing to bow to superior knowledge. In general terms I would welcome any moves to devolve powers from North Tyneside MBC, in the hope that local ears would be more sympathetic to local voices.
